- All exhibits should be accompanied with an entry slip marked with class number and containing name and address of entrant to be handed in with exhibit. Where applicable, slips to be attached to jars with elastic bands and pinned firmly to cakes or plates.
- No entry money refunded for articles which have been entered but which are not exhibited.
- No tinned or packet mixes to be used.
- In all matters, the decision of the Judges shall be final and no protest will be entertained.
- **ALL ARTICLES ON SHOW NOT INTENDED FOR SALE MUST BE CLEARLY MARKED "NOT FOR SALE"** and owners of these exhibits are requested to remove them just before the sale.
- Not more than one entry per exhibitor per class.
- Entrants names must be clearly stated.
